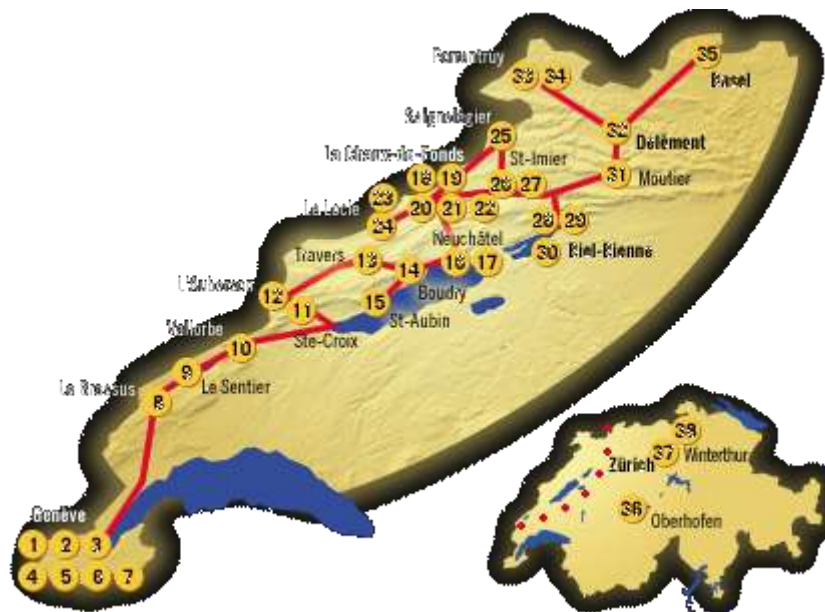

4. The Malbuisson Clock

Created by the watchmaker Edouard Wirth, the clock presents a daily show themed on the Escalade, the 1602 Savoy attack on Geneva. Every hour on the hour the 16 bells of the clock chimes while 42 bronze figurines and 13 chariots make their procession. The clock was first presented to the public on June 26th 1962.

5. The Cornavin Hotel Clock

6. The Flower Clock

Work of the Hungarian artist Klara Kuchta, the solar and laser clock has a face of 6.40 meters in diameter. Of stainless steel and laminated glass, it has 198 stars that shine and shimmer on a celestial map thanks to beams of light from optical fibres. It marries ancestral tradition with high technology by combining two light sources : the sun and the laser.
